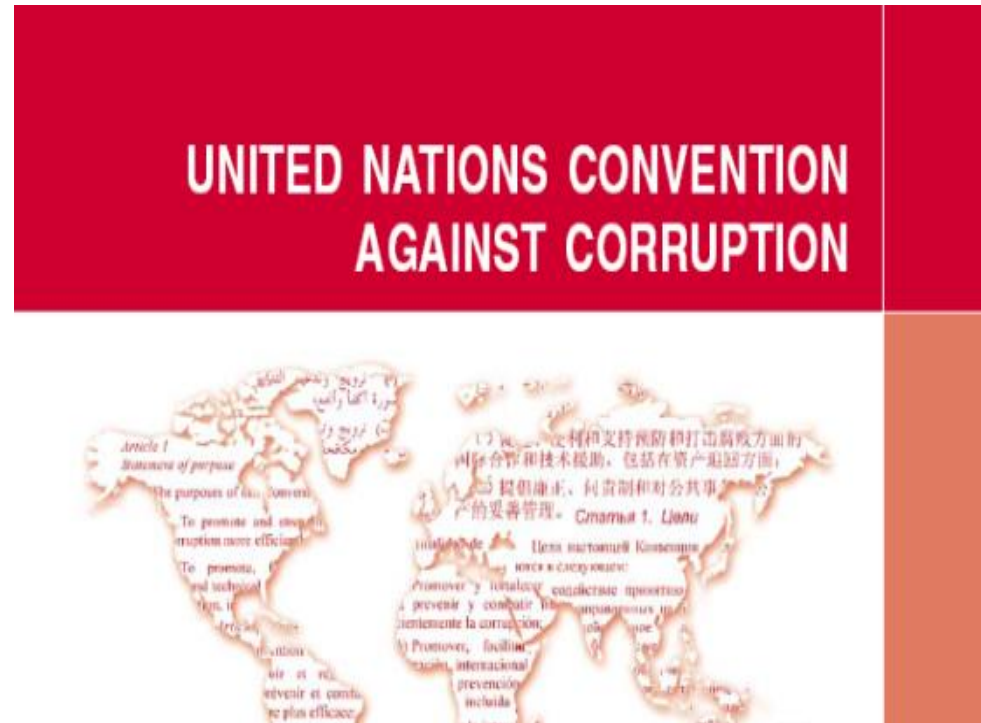
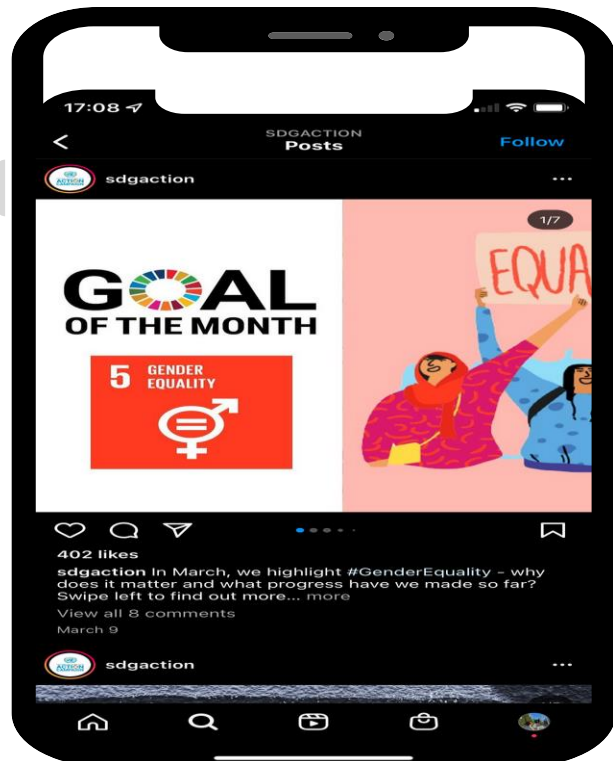

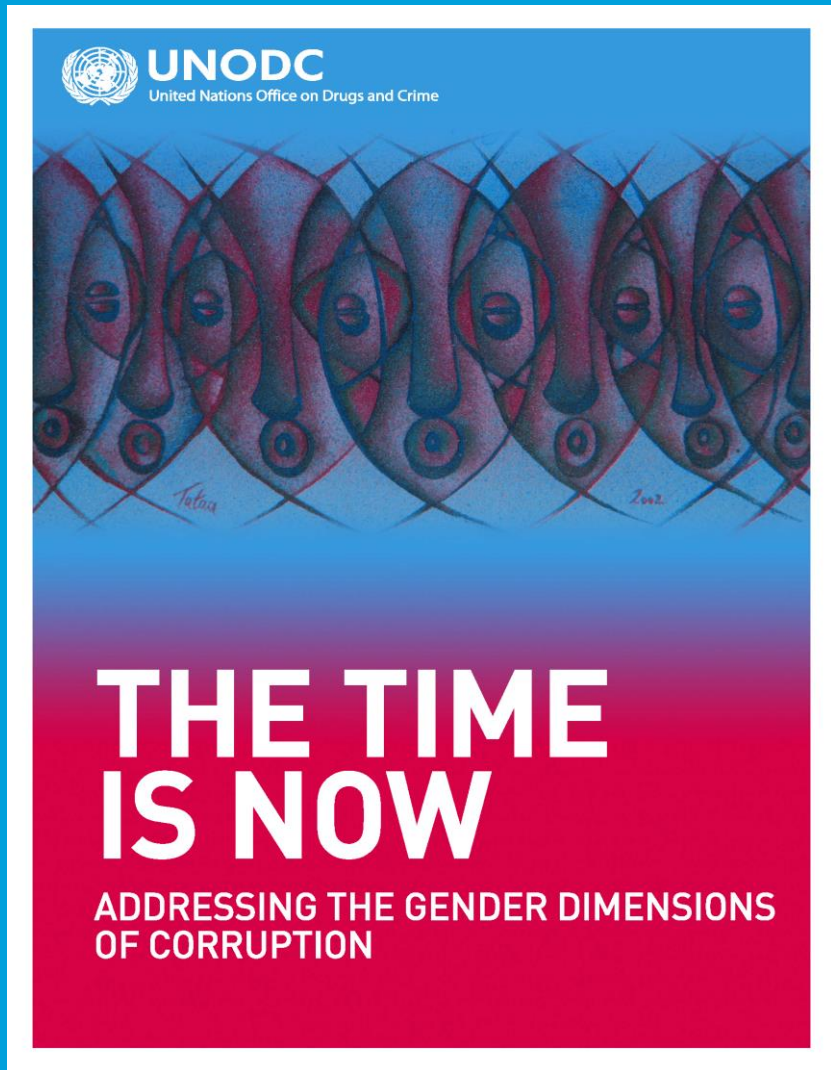

Research - corruption surveys, qualitative studies

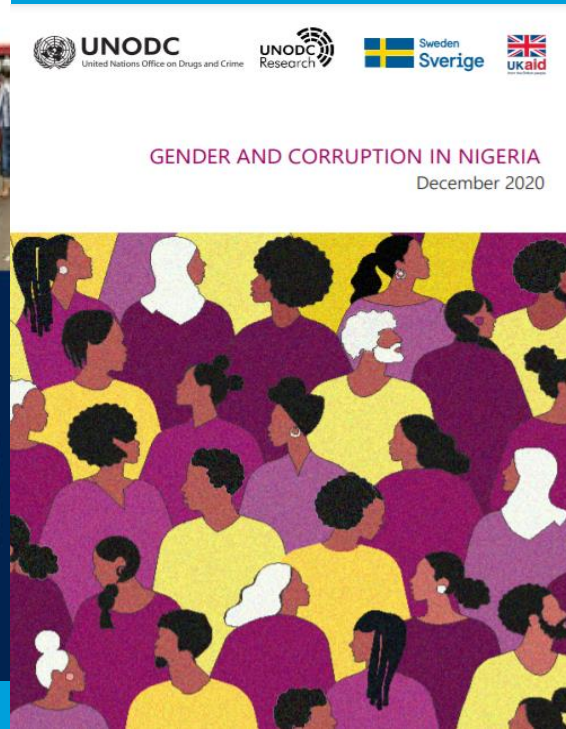
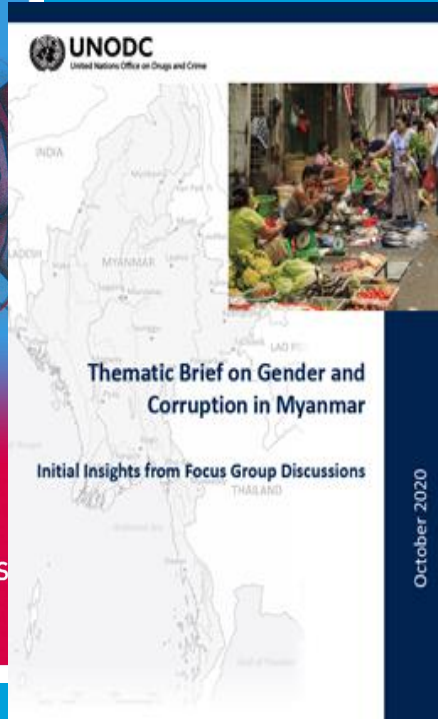
